

From the Pastor



A friend of mine who lives in Israel is bringing many Jewish people to faith in Yeshua! He recently wrote: In a few months, many Americans will be singing, "It's the most wonderful time of the year," but not for Israelis, the Feast of Tabernacles (or Sukkot), which is taking place right now, is the most joyous season of the Jewish calendar.

Back in the days of the Temple, everyday tens of thousands of Jews packed into the old city of Jerusalem. One of the highlights of the day was the water libation - when water from the pool of Siloam in the city of David was carried up to the Temple. It was then poured out on the altar as the people prayed for rain (the winter rains in Israel begin in October).

At night, they would come out to rejoice for this water ceremony. Regarding this event, there was a proverb in the Mishnah:

"He that has not seen the joy of the drawing (and the pouring) of the water has not seen joy in his life."

The Feast of Tabernacles like points to:

1. The ingathering of the Jewish people back to the Land of Israel;
2. The last great final harvest of souls;
3. The return of Yeshua and the setting up of his Messianic Kingdom;
4. The Jewish people recognizing that the one they rejected is their Messiah;
5. God forgiving their sin and bringing them into the age to come, the thousand year Messianic reign.

The feast of Tabernacles is a celebration that will be observed by the entire world in the millennial Kingdom. Delegations from every nation will come to Jerusalem to worship the new king, Yeshua.

Then the survivors from all the nations that have attacked Jerusalem will go up year after year to worship the King, the Lord Almighty, and to celebrate the Festival of Tabernacles. (Zechariah 14:16)

All this is what Jesus set into motion when He chose to Tabernacle here amongst us!

Praying for Men from Head to Toe

Pray for His Brain:

Ask that God would keep it sharp and focused and that his thoughts would not be conformed to this world, but would be transformed and renewed by the power of God. (Romans 12:2)

Pray for His Eyes:

Ask that he would guard them diligently and would set no worthless thing before them. (Psalm 101:3)

Pray for His Ears:

Ask that they’d be tuned to God’s still, small voice and that he would always remain attentive to the Holy Spirit’s promptings. (1 Thessalonians 5:19; Isaiah 30:9)

Pray for His Mouth:

Ask that no unwholesome talk would proceed from it, but only what is good for building others up. Pray that he would always and only speak the truth in love. (Ephesians 4:15, 29)

Pray for His Heart:

Ask that Christ would sit enthroned upon it, that he would love God with all his heart and soul and might, that he’d love his neighbor as himself. (Mark 12:30-31) Pray for his heart to remain soft toward his wife (Proverbs 5:18-19), and to be knitted to the hearts of his children. (Malachi 4:6)

Pray for His Arms:

Ask that God would strengthen them and make them firm. Pray that he would take delight in his labor and that God would bless the work of his hands. (Psalm 90:17; Ecclesiastes 3:22)

Pray for His Legs:

Ask that God would give him strength and stamina, that he might run with endurance the race that is set before him, without growing weary or fainting along the way. (Hebrews 12:1; Isaiah 40:31)

Pray for His Feet:

Ask that they’d be quick to flee from temptation, to turn away from evil, and to faithfully pursue wisdom, righteousness, peace, love, and truth. (2 Timothy 2:22; Psalm 34:14; Proverbs 4:5-7)
